


Special thanks to Rose and John MacIntosh for the recent flower arranging activity. Their kind donation of all the flowers and accessories made this activity even more enjoyable.



Our year started off a hot one where we have spent time


in the sun, under the sprinkler and enjoying refreshing ice blocks.
