
Here we are into the 2025 year and I think we're already wondering where the time has gone.


The year has started with a bang with us returning to previous activities, along with new experiences for some people we support.









We've returned to a favourite activity- T-Ball. Courtney couldn't wait to swing for the ball, while it was a new experience for both Isaac and Charlotte.






