
Bishopdale






A huge thank you to Downer for their generous donation which enabled us to buy items for our sensory room, enhancing this wonderful breakout space for the people we support to enjoy.


Welcome to our first newsletter of 2026. We hope you all had a joyful Christmas and a happy new year.
